All entries should be made by Saturday 1st July 2023 and emailed or posted to the Secretary. Entry Fees of less than £10 can be paid whilst staging.

Late entries may be accepted at the Secretary's discretion but are not guaranteed.

There are no online entries for this year.

No acknowledgement of receipt of entries will be made unless a stamped addressed envelope is enclosed. Email entries will be acknowledged.

#### **EXHIBITORS ENTRANCE PASSES**

Exhibitors Entrance Passes to the show on Saturday will be handed out to those who qualify during staging on Friday evening or by prior arrangement with the Secretary. To qualify, Exhibitors must enter 10 or more classes from the schedule. Under 16's qualify on entering 4 or more classes. Exhibitors in the Floral Art section qualify on entering 3 floral art classes. Exhibitors in the Group Section qualify for 2 passes.

#### **STAGING**

All Exhibitors are kindly asked to stage their exhibits on Friday 7th July from 6pm until 10pm. The Marquee will re-open at 6.30am on Saturday morning for final staging and items must be in position for 8.00am when the Marquee will be closed for judging.

No exhibitor cards will be issued after 7.45 am.

#### **VEHICLE DEPOSIT SYSTEM**

VEHICLES DRIVING DOWN TO THE MARQUEE ON SATURDAY MORNING WILL BE CHARGED A DEPOSIT OF  $\mathfrak{L}20$ . THIS IS REFUNDABLE IF THE VEHICLE IS REMOVED TO THE UPPER CAR PARK BEFORE 10.00AM. PLEASE HAVE YOUR  $\mathfrak{L}20$  READY TO AVOID UNNECESSARY HOLDUPS AT THE GATE

### **RULES**

- 1. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and, with the exception of classes 301 onwards, must have been grown on his/her property.
- 2. All entries should be written on one side of the Entry Form, complete with address, email address and contact number and entry fees should be shown.
- 3. All plates, vases, stands, etc must be provided by the exhibitor. Jam jars, milk bottles, tin cans, etc. MUST NOT BE USED FOR FLOWERS.
- 4. All exhibits must not have won a prize at Newport Show before.
- 5. Dirt, unnecessary leaves etc. must be removed from vegetables. Handicraft items must be clean.
- All exhibits to be staged by 7.50 am prompt. No exhibitor cards will be issued after 7.45 am.

- All Exhibitors to be in the marquee at 4.45 pm for presentation of trophies. EXHIBITS MAY BE REMOVED AFTER PRIZEGIVING. NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED ON TO THE SHOWGROUND BEFORE 5.30 pm FOR COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS.
- All exhibits, personal property, etc. shall be at the risk of the Exhibitors and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. Should the Show for any reason not be held, no exhibitor shall have any claim on the Society.
- Exhibitors shall be issued with an exhibitor card corresponding to each of their entries
  and this must be placed with each exhibit. Failure to do so may lead to disqualification
  of the exhibit. EXHIBITORS ARE TO MAKE SURE THAT EXHIBITS ARE IN THE CORRECT CLASS WITH CORRECT CARDS.
- 10. Objections by Exhibitors must be lodged, in writing, to the Secretary by 2.00 pm on Show day with a deposit of 50p for each objection. If the Committee, whose decision is final, does not uphold the objection the exhibitor shall forfeit his/her deposit.
- 11. NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE ALLOWED MORE THAN ONE ENTRY IN ANY ONE CLASS.
- 12. The Judges may disallow any prize if they consider an exhibit to be of insufficient standard. They may also award an extra prize for High Standard of Merit. THE JUDGE'S DECISION WILL BE AT ALL TIMES FINAL.
- 13. Where the Judges award prizes of equal merit, the Exhibitors are to understand that such prize money will be added together and divided equally. All prize money etc. will be given out from the Secretary's table in the marquee from 4.30 pm to 5.30 pm.
- 14. DEFINITIONS -The words 'kind' and 'variety' are used in this Schedule in the following sense: Sweet Peas, Roses, Carnations are kinds. Superstars, Peace, Doctor are varieties of Rose. Royal Wedding, Midnight, The Doctor are varieties of Sweet Peas.
- 15. ALL CHALLENGE CUPS AND SHIELDS ARE PRESENTED THEN RETAINED BY THE SOCIETY, CUPS AND SHIELDS FROM 2022 TO BE RETURNED TO THE SECRETARY BY 30th JUNE 2023.
- 16. These rules shall be deemed to incorporate the GENERAL RULES AND BYELAWS of the Agricultural Society but in the case of variance or inconsistency the Rules shall prevail.

- Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in a show schedule, e.g. the measurements or components.
- Inclusion of artificial plant material, (unless specifically allowed by the schedule)
- Inclusion of any fresh material that does not have its roots or the cut ends of stems in water or water-retaining material.

**Exceptions:** Air plants, cacti, fruits, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material which will remain turgid for the duration of the Show.

For further details and definitions please refer to the latest NAFAS 'Competitions Manual', in accordance with which, all classes will be judged. Flowers may be arranged before bringing them to the show.

### SPECIAL NOTE TO CHILDREN EXHIBITORS

Classes 402, 403, & 421 MUST be arranged by the exhibitor him/herself without the aid or supervision of any adult in the marquee. This rule will be enforced.

All Children's Classes first prizewinners will receive a rosette. Everyone entering the Children's Classes MUST state their age (at the date of the show) on the entry form.
