## RULES

1. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and, with the exception of classes 70 to 77, must have been grown on his/her property.
2. Please use online system for entries although paper entries will be accepted this year. Please ensure all sections are completed.
3. All exhibits must not have won a prize at Newport Show before.
4. All exhibits to be staged by 7.45 am prompt.
5. All Exhibitors to be in the marquee at 4.30 pm for presentation of trophies. Exhibits may be removed after prizegiving. no vehicles will be allowed on to the showground before 5.30pm. for collection of exhibits.
6. All exhibits, personal property, etc. shall be at the risk of the Exhibitors. The Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever, nor liability if the show is cancelled.
7. Exhibitors shall be issued with an exhibitor card corresponding to each of their entries. Please ensure exhibits are in the correct class with correct cards.
8. Objections by Exhibitors must be lodged, in writing, to the Secretary by 2.00 pm on Show day with a deposit of £5.00 for each objection. If the Committee, whose decision is final, does not uphold the objection the exhibitor shall forfeit his/her deposit.
9. No exhibitor will be allowed more than one entry in any one class.
10. The Judges will only award prizes on their consideration of merit. The judge's decision will be at all times final.
11. Adult prizemoney Will be paid out by bacs within 10 days of the show. Childrens prizewinners will receive cash on the day from 4.15 pm to 5.15 pm.
12. All challenge cups and shields are presented then retained by the society, An opportunity to hold and be photographed with your cup will be available during the Presentation. A list of prizewinners and photographs may appear in the Press or Social Media.

Maximum size: 40cm width × 40cm depth × 30cm height for arrangement, plus a table setting maximum size 30cm depth and 50cm wide to include a maximum of 2 plates and 2 glasses, cutlery and napkin should be included for display purposes.
